WEEKLY ACADEMIC PROGRESS REPORT

Dear Teachers:

First, let us thank you in advance for your cooperation with the academic progress reports for our players. The Jr. Wildkit program is committed to our player's success not only on the field, but also in the classroom, and in life. The more we can stress the link between academic, athletic and social accomplishment, the greater chance our players have to succeed. Attached, you will find a progress sheet listing each class the student has, as well as the following categories: **Work Completion, Standards Met, and Conduct**. "Work Completion" is self-explanatory. "Standards Met" involves assessing whether homework, class work, and testing, is completed to standard. Conduct includes behavior, attitude, and general participation. We would greatly appreciate it if you would evaluate our participant's performance in your class using the key we have established and included on the attached form for your convenience.

Please insert comments you feel are warranted (positive or negative) about a player's academic performance. Positive marks and comments will certainly be rewarded, and if "U's" are present we want to help change that behavior before it becomes habitual. Any additional information you can provide is vital in this effort.

This sheet will be distributed to our players on Tuesday of each week until the completion of our season (end of October), and we have requested the students turn them in on Thursday. The players have been informed that the content of their academic reports will influence their playing time. If a form is not turned in the player is ineligible to participate at game time. We understand that this form may not always be completed right away, so we will accept sheets from students up to Saturday's practice. Our participants have also been advised not to approach teachers at the end of the day Thursday or Friday.

Again, we thank you for your commitment to making our student athletes continually aware of their responsibilities in the classroom, at home, and on the field. Our program continually reinforces to our student/athletes the fact that academics come first; but that they also need to learn to balance school with the rest of their lives as early as possible. It is important to us to instill a sense of urgency about schoolwork primarily, as well as outside activities, so our students can begin to develop positive habits that will help them much further down the road.

We strongly encourage you to contact us any time, before, during or after the season, if there is anything at all you wish to discuss.
